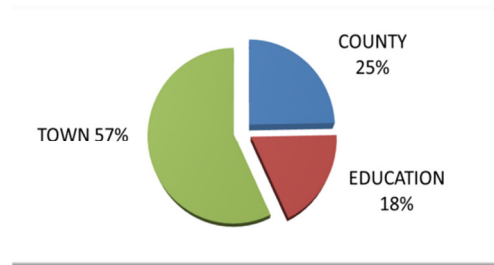




Where do my Tax Dollars Go?

PROPERTY TAX COMPONENTS

Property Taxes collected are allocated to three sources including the Town of Arnprior (57%), the County of Renfrew (25%) and Education (18%).



TAX PAYMENT OPTIONS

On-Line Banking

Payments can be made on-line at your banking institution. Use the search term "Town of Arnprior" and use your 19 digit roll number as the account number with no spaces or dashes. If you own multiple properties, please set up a separate account for each property.

In-Person

Payments can be made in-person at Town Hall located at 105 Elgin Street West. Town Hall Office hours are Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Due to the downtown construction, property tax payments will also be accepted at the Nick Smith Centre until August 31, 2017.

Accepted methods of payment include cash, cheque or debit. Credit cards are not accepted for property tax payments.

After-Hours Drop Off

An after-hours drop off mail slot is located at the front door of the Town Hall building located at 105 Egin Street West.

By Mail

Payment can be made by mail addressed to the Town of Arnprior, 105 Elgin Street West, Arnprior ON, K7S 0A8.

Please make cheques payable to the Town of Arnprior and include your tax stub or reference to the roll number to which the payment applies.

Taxation Information

Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC)

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is responsible for administering property assessment.

Property assessments are completed by MPAC on a four year cycle. The MPAC notice received in 2016 is the assessed value of your property as of January 1, 2016 and is used as the basis for calculating your property taxes for 2017-2020.

Assessment increases are phased in over four years and assessment decreases are effective immediately.

Overdue Accounts

Payments by any method must reach our office by the due date. Please note that on-line banking payments made after business hours will not be processed by the bank and reach our offices until the next day. Payments received by mail are based on the date received at Town Hall, not by the post mark date on the envelope.

A penalty of 1.25% per month will be applied to outstanding balances on the first day of each month.

Due Dates

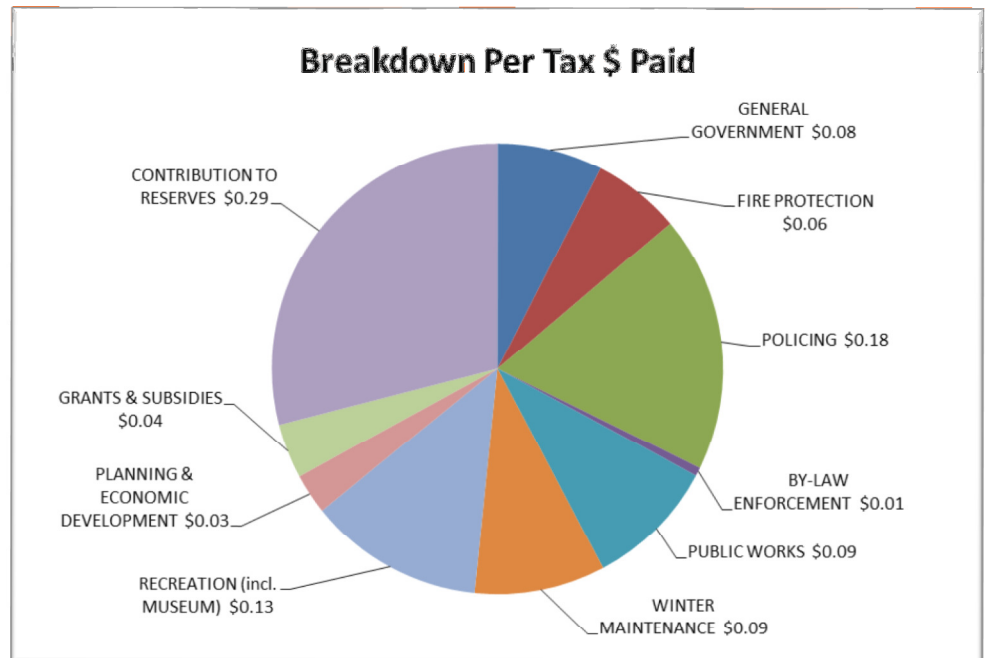
Interim tax bills were issued in January with instalments due February 28, 2017 and May 31, 2017. Final tax bills are issued in July with two instalments due August 31, 2017 and November 30, 2017.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from payment of taxes or penalties.

Tax Supported Expenditures

The 2017 Budget incorporates a modest 2.25% Municipal Tax Rate increase, which will result in a Town tax rate increase of \$1.98 per month or \$23.77 per year for the average residential home assessed at \$220,250. This "pay-as-you-go" budget is founded upon the principles of no new long term debt, paying down existing debt, increased annual contributions to reserves, as well as increased levels of investment into infrastructure renewal.

- Grants and Subsidies includes grant funding provided to recipients including the Arnprior Public Library, Arnprior & McNab/Braeside Archives and Arnprior Airport



The above graph demonstrates the breakdown of tax-supported expenditures per tax dollar paid to the Town of Arnprior.

- 29 cents of every tax dollar is put towards reserves which are used for pay-as-you-go capital investments.

SELF-SUSTAINING DEPARTMENTS

Self-sustaining departments such as Water and Wastewater Services, Waste Management, Protection, Inspection and Control and Cemeteries are excluded from the table above as they are not funded by tax dollars.

Capital Investments

Total capital investments into infrastructure projects, equipment and design in 2017 will be over \$6.19 M. Highlights include:

- \$4,177,000 – Downtown Revitalization Phase 2
- \$200,000 Rolling Road Rehabilitation

- \$535,000 – DA Gillies Building Remediation
- \$55,000 – Breathing Air System (Fire Dept)
- \$66,000 – Library Building Life Cycle Maintenance
- \$38,000 – Public Works Asphalt Hot Box
- \$117,000 – Water Pollution Control Centre Upgrades
- \$90,000 - Pump Station #4 Upgrades
- \$352,725 – Water Filtration Plant Treatment System Upgrades Phase 2
